

CLEANING GUIDELINES

CLEAN means to remove visible soils by using a product suitable for the surface being cleaned. DISINFECT means to kill germs by using a disinfectant cleaner, chlorine bleach solution or other disinfectant.

For ROUTINE DISINFECTING: use chlorine bleach solution (See Attached Sanitizing Solution Recipes) MUST BE MADE FRESH DAILY.

Sanitizing Solution Recipes

Don't guess at amounts! Most people use too much bleach.

For Disinfecting...

Diapering surfaces, bathrooms, hand washing sinks	Food surface areas, Toys	Blood Borne Pathogen Cleanup
500-800ppm	50-100ppm	1:10 Bleach/Water or SaniZide Plus Germicidal Solution
.75 tsp bleach to 8oz of water		
1.1 tsp bleach to 12oz of water	1/8 tsp bleach to 16 oz of water	
3 tsp bleach to 32 oz of water		
1Tbsp of bleach to 1qt water		2tbsp bleach to 10 oz of water
¼ cup of bleach to 1 gallon of water	1-2 tsp bleach to 1 gallon of water	1 5/8 cups bleach to 1 gallon of water
Operations will check concentration of bleach at Monthly Health and Safety Checks	Staff will check concentration of bleach daily	

Daily Cleaning Log

Cleaning logs need to be completed daily. The staff person responsible for each of the duties needs to initial after the cleaning is complete. The outdoor safety sweep must be completed prior to outdoor time daily. Each site needs to work together to develop a schedule of responsibility that works for their particular site.
